UCAP PROGRAM RULES

Participants are required to comply with the following rules:

- A. Maintain regular contact with UCAP staff and Wasatch Behavioral Health case manager.
- **B.** Attend all mandatory court hearings, adhering to the court mandated dress code, cell phone and electronic device regulations (see page 6 of Handbook).
- C. Be on time to each appointment, complete all treatment recommendations, sign required treatment ROI forms, and comply with treatment session rules (see page 9 of Handbook).
- **D.** Appear for drug testing as scheduled and/or when ordered by UCAP staff, following all drug testing requirements (see page 9 of Handbook).
- **E.** Notify any healthcare providers you visit that you are a UCAP participant, and explain the UCAP medication requirements, before receiving any prescriptions (see page 10 of Handbook).
- **F.** Do not act in any inappropriate sexual behavior or harassment toward staff, or other participants. These unacceptable actions will <u>not be tolerated</u> and will result in the filing of an Order to Show Cause, requesting termination.
- **G.** Do not make threats toward staff, other participants, or act in a violent manner. Threatening, aggressive or violent behavior will <u>not be tolerated</u> and will result in the filing of an Order to Show Cause, requesting termination.
- H. Completely abstain from using or possessing illegal drugs, drug paraphernalia, alcohol, or weapons.
- I. Do not frequent places where alcohol is the chief item of sale.
- J. Notify UCAP staff within 72 hours, if you are arrested or have contact, for any reason, with law enforcement, and identify yourself as a UCAP participant, to any law enforcement officer with whom you come in contact.
- K. Notify UCAP staff and court, within 24 hours, of any change of address or phone number.
- L. Pay treatment fees in full, prior to completion of the program.
- **M.** Obey all provisions of the "UCAP Program Supervision Agreement", your court ordered probation, and the rules of the UCAP Handbook.

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
